Prairie Spirit School Division is the largest rural school division in Saskatchewan, with over 10,700 students and 47 schools located in 28 communities surrounding the City of Saskatoon, and including three First Nations and nine Hutterian communities. Prairie Spirit has a dedicated team of professional and support staff serving pre-K to grade 12 students.

The Speech-Language Pathologist's role is a key leadership position working with other members of our educational community towards a common vision for Prairie Spirit School Division. The Speech-Language Pathologist will work closely with, and form an integral part of, a strong Division team providing shared, critical leadership within our education community.

THE POSITION

Speech Language Pathologists work collaboratively with our dedicated team of professional and support staffs to create a positive learning environment as part of our vision of Learners for Life. The goal is to provide support to school teams to meet students' learning outcomes in an inclusive setting to develop student independence, formal and informal assessment, programming recommendations, and progress monitoring. The successful candidates for these positions will work according to the Prairie Spirit yearly school calendar, observing working and holiday days as followed by the teaching staff. One position starts on March 5, 2018 and the second will begin on May 3, 2018. Both positions will end on June 29, 2018.

The successful candidates will:

- Have a Master's degree in the area of responsibility.
- Be a member of, and licensed with, the Saskatchewan Association of Speech-Language Pathologists and Audiologists (SASLPA).

Preference will be given to candidates who:

- Have relationship-building as the foundation of strong interpersonal and communication skills;
- Work effectively in a team environment;
- Demonstrate superior organization and planning skills;
- Show evidence of a shared, reflective leadership style;
- Be involved in professional development;
- Show commitment to innovation in education and learning communities;
- Value adaptive leadership and value the contribution of all members of the learning community;
- Show a commitment to individual and organizational accountability.
